LLM in Transnational Business Practice

The LLM in Transnational Business Practice trains lawyers to practice in the field of international business law. The degree further prepares lawyers for a career in the global economy. Students have the opportunity to engage in advanced scholarship by pursuing a Master's Thesis or Directed Research Project.

A program highlights is access to the McGeorge Global Center for Business & Development, which stands as the interface between the global economy and the legal profession. The Global Center facilitates scholarship and curricular innovation, and hosts a number of international events every year. Students earn the LLM in Transnational Business Practice after completion of 24 units of study, full-time or part-time.

• Externship Track – The best way to learn something new is to practice. Students have the opportunity to extern with a domestic or international law firm for class credit.

LLM in U.S. Law & Policy

The U.S. Law and Policy Program is designed specifically for foreign lawyers or graduates with a non-U.S. law degree. This is an ideal degree for those who wish to work fin the U.S. or take a bar exam. Students earn the LLM in U.S. Law & Policy after completion of 24 units of study. Students can complete the program in either one year (2 semesters) or two years (3 or 4 semesters). There are two required courses, and students may choose to focus on specific substantive areas, such as:

- International or Domestic Business law
- Intellectual Property
- Civil and Constitutional
- Criminal Justice
- Environmental Law

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LLM in Water & Environmental Law

The LLM in Water & Environmental Law Program emphasizes interdisciplinary natural resources classes; simulations and case studies; a robust field placement experience; and advanced substantive law course work. The combination of natural resources science, technology and economics, with strong legal coursework and hands-on training, makes this program unique among other natural resources law graduate degrees. McGeorge's program provides students with the opportunity to learn from a distinguished faculty and program team as well as from panels of experts who are focused on water and environmental law and the changing policies surrounding both.

The LLM in Water & Environmental Law Program consists of 24-units. Students can complete the program in either one or two years. Students also have the option to take courses online or in-person.

• LLM in Water & Environmental Law, U.S. Law Track – This track focuses on issues affecting the United States. It is designed for students with a law degree seeking togain expertise in the growing field of environmental and natural resources law.

• LLM in Water & Environmental Law, Online – McGeorge's online LLM in Water & Environmental Law Program is an advanced law degree designed for JD graduates who seek to gain expertise in this rapidly evolving area of practice. The program is taught through part-time, asynchronous courses that are fully online.

• LLM in Water & Environmental Law, International Track – This track is for law graduates interested in pursuing careers in government, non-governmental organizations, or private law firms dealing with international water and environmental issues. This program focuses on the unique laws, policies and political dynamics as it applies to water courses and other natural resources that are shared by two or more nations.

The LLM Program at McGeorge gave me an excellent opportunity to be exposed to the common law system with the help of experts in their fields, and I am truly grateful for that. Faculty

McGeorge School of Law is home to a varied group of professors, faculty and advisors with a wide range of international legal experience. Here are some of the impressive faculty members with whom you will learn and engage at McGeorge.



Professor Omar Dajani is Co-Director of the law school's Global Center for Business & Development, is recognized as a leading expert on legal aspects of the Palestinian-Israeli conflict. Widely published in legal and policy journals, Professor Dajani's scholarly work explores the links between international law, legal and political history, and contract and negotiation theory.



Professor Jennifer L. Harder teaches Water Resources Law and Water & Environmental Law Practice. Harder is the Faculty Director for the Online Programs at McGeorge. She brings to the classroom a decade of experience as an attorney and partner in a premier natural resources practice, and is a co-author of the highly respected, Cases and Materials on Water Law, 9th ed.



Professor Stephen McCaffrey was named 2017 Stockholm Water Prize Laureate for his unparalleled contribution to the evolution and progressive realization of international water law. He served as Special Rapporteur for the UN Convention on the Law of the Non-Navigational Uses of International Watercourses. He teaches International Water Resources Law and International Environmental Law.



Professor Frank Gevurtz's work shows an equally strong commitment to teaching future lawyers. His casebook, Business Planning (now in its fifth edition) has guided students at McGeorge and scores of other law schools from coast to coast through an elaborate problem set in which they aid clients in forming, financing, restructuring and selling a company, thereby bringing experiential legal education to students interested in being business attorneys. Professor Gevurtz frequently speaks on panels of leading legal educators exploring the need to globalize the law school curriculum.



Professor Jarrod Wong is Co-Director of the Global Center at McGeorge. He is a scholar in international dispute resolution and has written on complex problems in investment arbitration. He teaches International Economic Law, International Arbitration, and Contracts.

Frequently Asked Questions

Is there an international student community?

Yes, there is a thriving international student community at McGeorge providing JD and LLM students with many opportunities to socialize, gain additional academic support and secure any resources they may need as they adjust to life in the U.S. The Graduate & International Programs Office will also assist you in making a smooth transition to life at McGeorge.

Do LLM students have access to the same kinds of extracurricular activities as JD students?

LLM students are eligible to participate in most of the extracurricular activities available to JD students. McGeorge has a lively student community including various student organizations, social and academic events and intramural sports.

Can I take online classes?

Students enrolled in the LLM in Water & Environmental Law Program have the option to take courses online or in-person.

Do I have to take the LSAT or a similar test before applying?

There is no entry or LSAT type exam that must be taken prior to applying to the LLM programs at McGeorge.

How long should my personal statement be?

Your personal statement should contain all information that you believe is relevant for the admission committee to make a decision. Generally, personal statements in excess of four (4) pages would be considered too lengthy.

When should I reserve my campus housing?

On-campus housing is allocated on a first-come first-served basis. To be eligible to reserve housing, you must have paid your deposit in full. Private apartments or rooms near the Law School are also available for rent, although it is most convenient to live on-campus.

When and how do I get my student visa?

After you have been admitted to McGeorge, we will send you a letter with detailed instructions about how to obtain your visa.

If I am not a U.S. citizen, will I be able to work while I study?

The U.S. regulations do not allow F-1 or J-1 visa holders to be employed off-campus until they have completed one year of academic studies. After completing the LLM degree, F-1 students are entitled to a year of Optional Practical Training (OPT) which allows them to be employed in the field of law.

Admission

Applicants for admission to the LLM programs must present evidence of:

- Graduation from a school of law in a foreign country whose educational authority has authorized that school to issue degrees in law; or
- Graduation from a school of law approved by the American Bar Association, or
- Admission to the Bar of a state in the United States or overseas.

Deadline

We are currently accepting and reviewing applications for fall 2022. The priority application deadline for fall 2022 admission is March 30, 2022. After the priority deadline, we will continue to accept and review applications on a rolling basis.

LLM Application Checklist

- □ Complete our Online Application or LSAC Application.
- □ Submit the following documents:
 - Curriculum vitae (résumé);
 - □ Statement of Interest;
- Original official transcripts from colleges, universities, and graduate or professional schools attended, including current law school transcript (application materials in languages other than English must be accompanied by certified English translation);
- Two letters of reference, preferably from law school professors or legal employers;
- □ For non-native English speakers, proof of English proficiency:
 - Receipt of an undergraduate or graduate degree from an English language institution; OR
 - Multi-year employment in a position in which English is the primary language of communication; OR
 - □ A minimum test score of 88 (Internet-based) on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), or 6.5 on the International English Language Testing System (IELTS).



Visa Information

The visa application process may differ depending upon the requirements of the specific consulate office in your home country. Our Graduate and International Programs Office will work individually with each student, guiding them through the F-1 visa process. Please keep in mind that U.S. consulate offices are often extremely busy in the summer months, as many students are applying for a visa. **We recommend that our international students start the visa process no later than June 1.**

² Subject to change/approval by the Board of Regents. Health Insurance is mandatory for students enrolled in six (6) or more units. Students not attending on an F-1 Student Visa may opt out of the Pacific Student Health Insurance Plan by completing an online waiver, and providing acceptable proof of comparable health coverage by the announced deadline.

³ Wellness Center Fee is \$165/semester for students taking 9+ units and \$90/semester for students taking less than 8.5 units
